

Coming from the Blue Route either from Philadelphia or the western/northern suburbs (476):


- Take exit 3 (Media/Swarthmore)

Dear fellow members,

These two clubs had their membership reinstated with the WCI:

1. International Women's Club of Israel IWC

2. Welcome Clubs International California WCIC

The President of the WCI, Vivienne Shen, from Taiwan, was installed at our Board of Directors Meeting on May 15 for a term of two years. Here is her interesting biography:

Vivienne Shen holds a master's degree in law and taught law at the university level in Taiwan for five years. She gave up her teaching career to accompany her husband's appointment as a career diplomat and has lived in many countries worldwide. She resided twice in South Africa, once in Johannesburg, the other in Pretoria, Manila, the Philippines, Helsinki, Finland and Chicago, USA. Almost every three years, Vivienne packs and unpacks for a new journey.

In 2003, on her return from Pretoria, Vivienne joined the Welcome to Taipei International Club (WTIC). She immediately became the club's General Secretary and the Club Liaison to Welcome International Club (WCI) where she served for three years. She organized a delegation of eight WTIC members, herself included, to attend the 2004 WCI Biennial Conference in London.

In 2012, when moving back from Chicago, Vivienne was re-appointed as the WTIC General Secretary and Liaison to WCI until the end of 2016. In 2017, she was elected WTIC Vice-President. During this period, she attended the WCI Board of Directors' meeting three times; in Istanbul in 2013, London in 2015 and in Cyprus in 2017. From 2016-2018, Vivienne served on the WCI's Executive Committee and was appointed Regional Membership Chair for Asia. During her term, she accompanied the then-WCI President, Maria Fernanda, to Indonesia and visited the Women's International Club Jakarta (WICJ). The WICJ club received a formal invitation to join the WCI, with WICJ becoming a WCI Member.

From 2018-2020, Vivienne served as the WTIC President. In 2018, she travelled to Manila to attend the Federation of Asia -Pacific Women's Association (FAWA) Convention and was elected Board member. She serves on the Board of the National Council of Women, Taiwan (NCW) in her third term as the Board's Director.

Since WCI's granting to the UNNGO with Special Consultative status in ECOSOC, Vivienne is one of the eight WCI UN Council members working to achieve UNNGO's mission, including hosting a UN CSW67 Parallel Event. She has hosted four CSW parallel events during her 2020-2022 term as Zonta International District 31 (Taiwan and Mongolia) Governor and is the District's Head Officer. She has been a Zonta member for 30 years and has served as Chair of the International Bylaws and Resolutions Committee for the past four years. She is organizing a Zonta Asian Inter-District Meeting in Taiwan in April 2023, with more than 700 members from Asian countries scheduled to attend meetings.

I was born and raised in Augsburg, in southern Germany. My parents were both teachers and one of their subjects was teaching German as a foreign language. Growing up, our house was always filled with people from all over the world and we had especially close connections to a nearby US military base. On our summer vacations we often visited Italy and I developed a deep affection for everything Italian: art, culture, food, and language. I decided I wanted to live there one day, so I studied art

history and Italian, first in Augsburg, then in Siena and later worked as an intern at the Pinacoteca Comunale in Ravenna. I focused on Italian Renaissance art in both my Master's and Ph.D. thesis and spent extended periods of time doing my research in Italy.

In Germany, I frequently traveled to the nearby city of Munich to study at the Central Institute of Art History, a library that was created after WWII for the Central Collecting Point, helping an international team of art historians to identify and repatriate looted artworks. One day, I met a newly arrived American fellow there and a couple of years later Derick became my husband. After the fellowship ended, he got a job in his hometown Philadelphia, while I got a job at the State Graphic Arts Collection in Munich, working on early Italian drawings. It took us 8 years to figure out how we can be closer and start a family. I moved to Philadelphia in 2005, but kept my place in Munich and to this day we travel back and forth often.

I work as a translator now, translating from English or Italian into German and from German into English, focusing on my favorite topics, art, culture, food and wine. I can also decipher almost any form of old German handwriting and offer transcription services for museums or manuscript dealers. Our son William is bilingual and he spends every summer with me in our Munich home. From there we travel to neighboring European countries, or just the nearby Alps, hiking and swimming in the beautiful Bavarian lakes. Another favorite pastime of mine is knitting. When I moved to Philadelphia, knitting and chatting with the women in a local knitting club created lasting bonds. I am happy to be part of IWCP and am looking forward to making new friends and learning about your stories.

Hello, I'm Jennifer Nakahara. I grew up in Malvern, PA and now live in Chester Springs. I studied abroad in London my junior year of high school and fell in love with the international lifestyle.
